

#### This is where you will embark: Scarborough, Tobago

The island is known for its laid-back lifestyle, breathtaking sunsets, and its vast tropical forest with hiking trails and waterfalls. Divers can enjoy the rocky gorges and deep caves with dolphins, whale sharks and manta rays.



# Our sailing waters: the Grenadines

After a thorough safety briefing and sailing instructions from the experienced crew, you will soon be familiar with the ship and be able to take part in the sailing yourself – always on a voluntary basis, of course. The smooth and steady up and down of the hull in the waves, the vast ocean and the soft creaking of the rigging are the perfect ingredients for a wonderfully relaxing holiday experience.







The Grenadines archipelago is a true dream destination, with one typical sandy beach island after another. Possible stopovers in the port or at a mooring spot are:

- Carriacou The small town of Winward is the centre of traditional sailing-boat building of the Grenadines. One often sees the wooden boats entering the lagoon under sail. Time seems to have stood still on this small and hilly island. You rarely see a car here, as most people go by foot. Anyone who climbs the mountains of the island is rewarded with a breathtaking view. Hillsborough fish market is another attraction for tourists that should not be missed. In Tyrell Bay, beautiful small beach restaurants invite you to linger and soak up the Caribbean maritime flair.
- Petit Martinique / Petit St. Vincent These two neighbouring islands are surrounded by every imaginable shade of blue and turquoise. Petit Martinique is an island that needs no glamour to exude its charm. Traders sail from mooring to mooring with their colourfully painted wooden boats, selling fish, lobsters, cold drinks and fresh bread. The private island of St. Vincent is designed as a luxury resort, where delicious rum punch is served in the stylish beach bar.
- Tobago Cays Only six nautical miles away lies the mooring spot just off the Petit Bateau island with its fine sand beach and a Robinson Crusoe feel. Huge lizards can be found basking in the sun on the sundrenched rocks. The archipelago is a nature reserve, but anchoring there is allowed.
- Bequia Admiralty Bay is a picturesque protected natural harbour. In Port Elizabeth, the capital of the island, a promenade links the town with the hotels and restaurants in the south. Each building has been lovingly painted, decorated and is well-maintained. Shops with unusual hand-crafted items, and a variety of stalls selling all kinds of tropical fruit are waiting to be explored. The islanders are descendants of Scottish farmers, African slaves and American whalers. Even today, the whaling tradition is kept alive. With its reefs and an impressive variety of fish, the underwater world is fascinating.
- Hog Island / Grenada The peninsula is inhabited only by cows and goats. On the way to our port of arrival, we will find a quiet mooring spot on the west side of the main island.



### This is where you will disembark: St. George's, Grenada

When we arrive in Port Louis, the Eye of the Wind will already be your personal "dream ship". The capital of St. George is considered one of the most beautiful cities of the Antilles. Grenada is the "Isle of Spice" – a subtle, spicy scent wafts through the city when nutmegs are being roasted. South of the city centre lies Grand Anse, a palm-fringed sand beach stretching kilometres. The bay is easily accessible by dinghy or by foot. The bay of Carenage bustles with activity, with fishermen selling their catch and mending nets.

The restored houses on the waterfront immediately catch the eye. Hiking tours through the jungle with a visit to the waterfalls or to the chocolate factory can be part of your tourist programme after the trip.
