This is where you will embark: Road Town, Tortola / British Virgin Islands

Our crew will welcome you on board in the port of Road Town on the Virgin Island Tortola at 19:00 hours. Afterwards, there will be dinner together in the comfortable lounge, where you will quickly feel at home on the Eye of the Wind's deck and soon get to know your fellow sailors.

With its combination of mild climate, beautiful landscape and Caribbean serenity, the port city exudes a very special holiday feeling. Before setting sail, why not make the most of your time by taking a walk through the botanical garden in the center of Road Town? And on the Main Street of the British Virgin Islands' capital, numerous colonial-style houses will tempt you to stroll through the shops and enjoy a drink or two in the bars and pubs. You will notice that a certain British etiquette is blended with the tranquility and cheerfulness of the "Caribbean way of life". Instead of high-rise buildings and casinos, visitors to the Virgin Islands will find nature parks and untouched, white sandy beaches that stretch for miles. Here and there, the shores are lined with prickly cactuses under which iguanas bask in the midday heat, and Mangrove trees with their knotted roots protruding from the water. Emerald hummingbirds suck nectar from colourful calyx flowers, and we can imagine the coral reef with its armada of tropical fish beneath the surface of the sea. The constant sound of the Atlantic Ocean will immediately dispel any thoughts of a "cold and wet February at home".



On board our modern tall ship that is equipped to the high standards, you will first get to know the crew and your fellow sailors. After a tropical welcome drink, you will soon feel comfortable on deck and in your air-conditioned cabin.

Setting sail for the Virgin Islands - Snorkeling and swimming in the Caribbean

After a thorough safety briefing and sailing instructions from our experienced and friendly crew, you will soon be familiar with the ship and be able to take part in the sailing yourself. Hands-on assistance on deck is always voluntary, so if you want, you can just relax and enjoy watching the daily sailing manoeuvers and the traditional seamanship in action, too.

The decision on which port or mooring spot to call on in the evening is usually made by the captain on the same day, and depends on the wind and weather conditions – whenever possible, your wishes will be taken into account. This ensures that your cruise is a pleasant mix of adventure, relaxation, active participation and pure enjoyment.

Along the coastline, a pleasant wind pushes us through the azure water. The smooth and steady swaying of the ship on the waves, the vast ocean, the fresh air in the mild sea climate, and the soft creaking of the rigging are all you need for a relaxing holiday experience. A few nautical miles later, the next of the roughly 60 British Virgin Islands will appear on the horizon.

We will drop anchor off Virgin Gorda, the third-largest island of the archipelago. Here, the randomly arranged granite boulders of "The Baths" form small caves and pools, and invite you to go exploring and do some snorkeling. In this natural lagoon, you can enjoy the sea and a first-class swim in the sun.

After a trip to the beach and a swim in the sea, you can round off the day with a glass of quality wine from the onboard bar while watching the sun go down.

After a night at anchor, we will cruise through the waters of the British Virgin Islands past islands with adventurous names such as Pelican, Dead Chest, Mosquito Island and Carrot Rock. Our excellent galley, which consistently receives the top grade of 1.0 in customer satisfaction surveys, offers food and refreshments around the clock, including regional delicacies. In the extensive onboard library, you will surely find a good book for a comfortable read under the sun sail on deck. After a day of sailing, you can round off the day by relaxing with a cocktail under the tropical night sky.
